

Facilitation (CPRR) Online course



What is the Facilitation

The Facilitation course equips instructors with the knowledge, skills and professional behaviours required to teach on the Child Protection: Recognition and Response provider course.

The programme focuses specifically on the educational approaches and modalities used within the course and provides opportunities for shared learning with colleagues across disciplines.

Delivered **online**, the course enables future instructors to engage actively with teaching methods and practise facilitation skills, before progressing to teach as an Instructor Candidate on the CPRR provider course.

What are the benefits of the course?

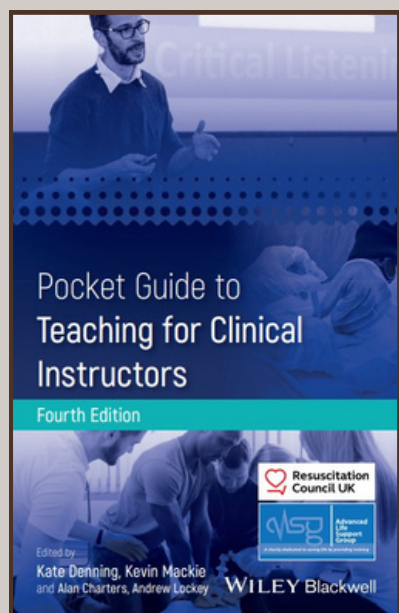
The online course covers the learning approach and preparation for facilitating on the CPRR course, and engagement in reflective practice.

- Prepare**
 - Structuring your teaching sessions using the format of Prepare Open Facilitate, Close
- Open**
 - Running engaging, interactive workshops
 - Taking part in learning conversations with peers
- Facilitate**
 - Managing a simulated patient encounter
- Close**
 - Practising debriefing

During the course there will be a focus on:

- Respecting the unique qualities of each learner
- Discovering your strengths as a facilitator
- Questioning your own taken for granted assumptions about teaching and learning

What to expect from the Facilitation course



The Facilitation course is delivered online by ALSG Educators. Participants will receive a copy of the Pocket Guide to Teaching for Clinical Instructors, and will be assigned teaching materials to practise delivering sessions to a small group of like-minded learners.

Once you have successfully completed the Facilitation course, you are required to teach on two courses as an Instructor Candidate. After completing your ICs you are then issued full instructor status. To keep instructor status valid, you must teach on three courses in a two year period.

Who can attend?

The purpose of this education programme is to prepare instructors to teach on the Child Protection Recognition and Response (CPRR)

Making it happen

There are two potential routes to becoming a CPRR instructor:

Route 1: Put forward as having instructor potential at the end of your CPRR course.
