



Welcome to our new Director of Technology

After months of dedicated planning throughout 2024—including a proof-of-concept course, two pilot runs, a brand-new manual, and fully updated teaching materials—the latest edition has been incredibly well received both in the UK and internationally.

We are thrilled to introduce the newest addition to ALSG's course portfolio: CYP APEx.



Clinicians have long expressed the need for a course like this. Just as resuscitation training is now an essential part of clinical preparedness, CYP APEx aspires to become a core component of high-quality, holistic care for young people in all healthcare settings.





Manchester Triage System (MTS) update

A peer reviewed paper was published by Anna Mackway-Jones, Rachael Hornby and Kevin Mackway-Jones, titled "Making more nurses" which was a study of an efficiency and quality improvement project, within emergency triage.

Showcasing our paediatric courses at the RCPCH Conference



We were delighted to join the RCPCH Conference in person in Glasgow earlier this year, showcasing three of our paediatric courses – Advanced Paediatric Life Support (APLS), Child Protection: Recognition and Response (CPRR) and the new and innovative Children and Young People: Acute Psychiatric/Psychosocial Emergencies (CYP APEx). A fantastic team of volunteers from each course, joined us to provide APLS simulation training, Child Protection case training and a demo of a new CYP APEx simulation involving an actor. All three were very well received and even featured in *Milestones*, the RCPCH publication, as highlights for delegates (click image to expand).



We also celebrated our wonderful Chair of Trustees, Stephanie Smith, who was presented with the prestigious award of RCPCH Honorary Fellow. Congratulations Stephanie!


It was fantastic to be part of this conference again this year and we look forward to seeing our colleagues again in 2026.



Earlier this year, members of the mMOET Working Group proudly showcased the course's simulations at several leading conferences, including the British Maternal & Fetal Medicine Society (BMFMS) Conference and the British Cardiovascular Society (BCS) Annual Conference.

The response from delegates was overwhelmingly positive, with many praising the realism, clinical relevance, and educational value of the simulations. The feedback highlighted the growing recognition that mMOET is a vital training programme for improving maternal outcomes in complex and high-risk situations.

The mMOET team are also preparing to run a dedicated training day for Emergency Medicine trainees at the Royal College of Emergency Medicine this October.



ALSG attended the Faculty of Liaison Psychiatry Annual Conference, held in London from 14–16 May. Members of the CYP APEx working group, Virginia Davies, Mark Buchanan, and Sarah Davies, presented the principles of the Acute Psychiatry course, with a particular highlight being a powerful actor-led CYP APEx simulation that left a strong impression on the audience.

Feedback from both event organisers and delegates was outstanding, once again underscoring the urgent need for CYP mental health simulation training to become standard practice. Attendees from a psychiatric background expressed a clear demand for this kind of resource, further validating the importance of this ground breaking course.

Education update

Child Protection in Practice (CPiP) - new e-module added



In 2024, ALSG launched phase one of the new and innovative online CPiP course, featuring eight brand-new e-learning modules. Earlier this year, an additional e-module on Legislation was introduced, providing an overview of safeguarding regulations across English, Scottish, Northern Irish, Welsh, and British legal frameworks.

The CPiP course offers exceptional flexibility—available as a complete package or as individual modules to help learners address specific training needs or gaps.



Neonatal, Adult and Paediatric Safe Transfer and Retrieval (NAPSTaR)

NAPSTaR is a well-established training programme focusing on the safe transfer of patients, both inter and intra hospital.

This year, the working group, led by Pete Johnson, has actively updated the course materials to reflect current best practice. These revisions were successfully piloted at ALSG in June, and we are excited to announce that the course will be relaunched later this year.

The updated course aims to minimise the risks associated with patient transfers and offers an excellent opportunity to refresh and enhance transfer-related training.



Facilitation courses take off



We were delighted to partner with Mountain Rescue England & Wales (MREW) to deliver Facilitation training for their trainers. In March, we ran two successful courses in Wasdale aimed at refining techniques in lecturing, coaching skills, and delivering realistic scenarios.


Excitingly, this Facilitation course is now being tailored to support instructors as they progress towards becoming APEx Faculty (CYP and Adult). The updated programme focuses on simulation techniques involving actors, group facilitation, and debriefing, carefully designed to meet the unique challenges of APEx training.

Advanced Paediatric Life Support (APLS)

The big news for the paediatric emergency courses is that the 7th edition APLS Recertification (APLS R) and PLS courses were launched earlier this year to align with APLS. The new editions of APLS R and PLS have been very well received. This portfolio of courses collectively addresses the training needs of paediatric colleagues at all levels.

The 7th edition of APLS has been in place since November 2023, with a full update of all simulations rolled out this spring (2025). To support instructors, video demonstrations of 7e simulations are now available on the ALSG website. Additionally, an updated set of skills videos is currently being edited and will be released in the coming months.

Looking ahead, a revised APLS manual, e-modules and associated teaching materials are scheduled for 2026, following the ILCOR/ERC updates that will be released in October 2025.




Education update

The updated version features a refreshed programme and several enhancements to the delivery. To support a smooth transition, we're committed to offering support and guidance to all our centres, course directors and instructors.





Major Incident training aligns with Martyn's Law



Our major incident courses MIMMS and HMIMMS have been providing pre-hospital and in-hospital emergency preparedness training for 30 and 25 years respectively.

MIMMS supports the training needs incorporated within Martyn's Law (the Terrorism [Protection of Premises] Act 2025) by offering a robust, evidence-based framework for planning, response and recovery before, during and after terrorist incidents in publicly accessible venues. MIMMS is now being delivered at Premier League football clubs, where emergency preparedness is paramount, recognising the value of structured, scenario-based training as a vital tool for safeguarding both staff and the public.



In addition, we're proud to share that the Military has now piloted a standardised version of the MIMMS programme incorporating discussions and tabletops for both civilian and military mass casualty events. This marks a major milestone in delivering consistent, high-quality training for those working in the most challenging environments.

We're excited to announce that the ALSG Conference is back and will be held at the Manchester Conference Centre on Wednesday, 24th September.



BestBETS

During his time at ALSG, our former Chair of Trustees, Professor Kevin Mackway-Jones, played a key role in the introduction of BestBETS, a clinical tool designed to support evidence-based decision-making in emergency care. BestBETS provides evidence-based guidance to clinicians who may be facing complex cases where traditional, validated solutions are unavailable, offering a vital 'steer' toward the most effective potential interventions. As part of Professor Kevin Mackway-Jones' retirement legacy, ALSG is revitalising its knowledge management offering, with BestBETS at the core aiming to raise awareness among clinicians of its evidence-based value and life-saving potential in clinical practice. ILCOR guidelines update 2025

New resuscitation guidelines are set to be launched at the European Resuscitation Council (ERC) Conference in October 2025. In response, ALSG will coordinate a collaborative review of all relevant course manuals and materials to ensure alignment with the updated guidance.

This review will cover the APLS, mMOET, POET, and NaPSTAR courses, with a dedicated working meeting planned for November 2025. The aim is to publish manual update documents and revised teaching materials in early 2026, with full manual revisions to follow as soon as feasible.
