Kim Hinshaw has been a Consultant Obstetrician & Gynaecologist at Sunderland Royal Hospital in North East England since 1994 and is Director of Research & Innovation for the Trust.

He trained in Newcastle upon Tyne and was Lecturer at the University of Aberdeen (1989-94) and holds a Visiting Chair at Sunderland University.

His clinical and research interests include high-risk pregnancy & intrapartum care. He has developed obstetric skills-drills & human factors training courses and leadership skills courses with Keele University & the RCOG.

Kim has been an active member of the ALSO (Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics) and mMOET (Managing Medical & Obstetric Emergencies & Trauma) UK Working Groups.

He is a medical advisor for the Swinfen Charitable Telemedicine Trust and national faculty lead for the 'BIRTH2' training programme run by the charity Baby Lifeline. He co-developed the Prehospital Obstetric Emergencies Training (POET) course for ambulance staff.

Kim is Education Lead for the British Maternal & Fetal Medicine Society and chair of the UKOSS steering committee (UKOSS undertakes research into rare pregnancy and delivery complications).
