Peter is a retired Emergency Medicine physician who worked as a consultant at Salford Royal Foundation Trust from 1990-2012.

During that time he was part of team which helped set up a coordinated resuscitation approach and an integrated trauma care service.

At a national level he was previously co-editor of the Emergency Medicine journal; Dean of the Royal College of Emergency Medicine and College Professor in Emergency Medicine. More locally, he was Crowd Medical lead for Manchester United FC.

At an international level he had the honour of being part of the group which helped set up ALSG. He was subsequently the director before retiring and becoming a Trustee.

He helped create and write the European Trauma Course as well as being an external examiner & assessor for the West Indies University DM examination in Emergency Medicine.

Between 2012 - 2016 he was honorary senior lecturer in anatomy at St Andrews University. He then became Academic lead for the Physician Associate programme at UCLan and eventually Faculty lead in clinically applied anatomy.

He has always had a keen interest in trauma care, has written a number of books and articles on this topic and has received a Smith Nephew Trauma fellowship. From the subsequent work and thesis, he was able with others, to implement a new approach to Trauma care in the UK.
